Then try:

<u>Lisa Kleypas and her Wallflower Series</u> – especially if you were rooting for Penelope, the wallflower.

<u>Tessa Dare and The Dutchess Deal</u> – like Anthony Bridgerton who needs an heir but is afraid of love.

<u>Evie Dunmore and Bringing Down the Duke</u> – although set in a later time period, if you like Eloise Bridgerton, you will like the strong independent woman who is the heroine of this book.

<u>Tessa Dare and A Week to be Wicked</u>, part of her Spindle Cove series – Of you enjoyed Daphne and Simon's fake courtship and how they tried to convince people they were in love.

Of course, you could also go back to two old masters of the marriage driven plot, make sure you check out <u>Georgette Heyer</u> and <u>Jane Austen</u>. Heyer has been credited with inventing the regency romance novel and its comedy of errors, which was in turn influenced by Jane Austen.
